Purpose and Scope:

Gender and Identity Worldwide

This 2-volume book will explore the lives of people around the world from the perspective of their gender identity. The book includes the male, female, and LGBTQ experiences. In a close examination of approximately 30 countries/geographic areas from a variety of world regions and with a variety of gender experiences, each gender and identity will be explored in terms of culture, education, family life, health and wellness, law, work, and activism. For example, in the culture section, the text will look at cultural beliefs and traditions around being a man, woman, and member of the LGBTQ community. The section on family life will look at the roles men, women, and LGBTQ people take on in family units. The section on law will look at the legal rights of each group. After these areas of life are explored, a section on contemporary issues follows, that examines 3-5 gender identity issues in that country's society. Each region and country is also accompanied by a short introduction, as well as brief facts and figures, that illustrate demographics and equality, or lack thereof.

Word Count: 343,000 to 353,000 total words in 2 volumes

Countries/Areas: approximately 30 entries (each about 11,200 words)

Delivery Schedule: Rough draft turned in by February 1, 2019 with final delivery by April 1, 2019.
